

Pet Survivorship Program Guidelines

Many friends of Great Plains SPCA who choose to make charitable contributions by bequest to the organization also ask about the possibility of entrusting their cat(s) and/or dog(s) to the care of the organization after their death.

While our first recommendation is that you identify a trusted and willing friend or family member to care for your pet after your death, we recognize that this alternative is not always possible. Therefore, we have adopted the following guidelines to help pet guardians as they prepare their wills and consider their charitable giving.

POLICY

Because Great Plains SPCA is continually faced with an inexhaustible supply of homeless dogs and cats needing new homes through our Adoptions Program, people wishing to surrender their cats or dogs generally must wait a few months before space is available. *In recognition of donors who make charitable bequests or provide irrevocable trusts to Great Plains SPCA, we will waive the usual waiting period.*

For the benefit of all animals taken into our Adoptions Program, it is important that charitable bequest donors who wish to leave their cats and/or dogs to Great Plains SPCA follow these essential guidelines:

- 1. The Adoptions Program is limited to cats and dogs. Cats and dogs will be adopted out through Great Plains SPCA.
- 2. Please be sure that your cat or dog is current on all required vaccinations, and that you keep their veterinary records with your other important documents.
- 3. Great Plains SPCA provides physical examinations, vaccinations and spaying/neutering for all our adoptable animals but, to keep costs down for Great Plains SPCA and the adoptive family, you are required to take care of these requirements <u>before</u> your animal comes to Great Plains SPCA.
- 4. In every instance, Great Plains SPCA considers what is best for the animals. For this reason, Great Plains SPCA will care for animals as long as they are physically healthy or until they are adopted. However, if the animal(s) start to significantly deteriorate and can no longer be made comfortable with an acceptable quality of life, euthanasia must be considered. This happens very rarely at Great Plains SPCA. The decision to euthanize an animal at the shelter rests solely with the staff of Great Plains SPCA.
- 5. In the unlikely event that your pet is deemed to have severe behavioral issues which pose a risk to the well-being of the pet, other animals, or individuals, or if the pet is found to be unmanageable under standard care conditions, the pet may be excluded from participation in

the Pet Survivorship Program. Severe behavioral issues may include, but are not limited to, aggression toward people or other animals or destructive tendencies that cannot be reasonably addressed through behavioral rehabilitation or modification efforts that Great Plains SPCA provides. The decision to exclude a pet from the program will be made at the sole discretion of Great Plains SPCA, based on a thorough assessment of the pet's behavior, medical history, and suitability for placement in a new environment.

It is our belief that cats and dogs belong in loving homes and not in a shelter. Therefore, all cats or dogs bequeathed to Great Plains SPCA will be put up for adoption. Rest assured, Great Plains SPCA's Adoptions Program goes the extra distance to match an animal's temperament and requirements with an adoptive family's lifestyle. Animals who are taken from their own homes sometimes suffer from stress and anxiety. The staff and volunteers of Great Plains SPCA make every effort to alleviate these problems through personal attention, enrichment and socialization techniques.

BEQUEST COMMITMENT

As a non-profit organization, Great Plains SPCA must continually seek donations to fund programs. Costs to shelter, feed, and provide medical care for the homeless animals in our care are substantial. *Therefore, it is necessary that charitable bequest donors make the financial provision of* **\$10,000 for up to two animals** and \$5,000 per each additional animal. Please note that there is no money due upon signing up for this program. Funds will go to Great Plains SPCA at the time your estate is settled.

PROCEDURES

Great Plains SPCA's Adoptions Program is not one where animals are simply placed in the first available home. Every step is taken to ensure that each adoption is a permanent match. If you wish to bequeath your cat or dog to Great Plains SPCA, please take care to complete the following steps to ensure their smooth and successful transition into life with a new adopter.

- 1. Ask your attorney to state specifically in your will that you wish to entrust your cat(s) or dog(s) to the Great Plains Society for the Prevention of Animal Cruelty Adoptions Program.
- Inform the executor of your estate, family members, and/or friends that you wish to have your dog and/or cat cared for by Great Plains SPCA so that the transfer of your animal(s) can be accomplished as soon as possible.
- 3. Complete the Cat and/or Dog Relinquishment Questionnaires on the following pages. These forms provide us with important information about medical history, lifestyle, preferences, and behavioral characteristics in order to helpour stafffind the best possible match with a new family. <u>Please fill out one complete questionnaire per animal</u>.
- 4. Ask your attorney to incorporate into your will the following suggested language for making a charitable contribution to Great Plains Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

Your gift may be unrestricted, or designated to the Adoptions Program, or any other program that interests you.

I give to Great Plains Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, a non-profit 501(c)(3), currently headquartered at 5428 Antioch Dr, Merriam, KS 66202, TIN 05-0552529, the sum of ______dollars (or, if insurance policies, land or other property, please describe). This gift is unrestricted and may be designated at the discretion of the organization's leadership. It is Great Plains SPCA's policy to assess a 10% overhead recovery fee to all bequests made to Great Plains SPCA (this is charged against the actual bequest and is not an extra charge)

5. <u>When your will, Letter of Intent (located on Great Plains SPCA's website) and Relinquishment</u> <u>Questionnaire(s) are complete, please notify Great Plains SPCA</u>

<u>in writing of your plans</u>. It must include a copy of the Relinquishment Questionnaire with your letter, to ensure that Great Plains SPCA has current information about your cat(s) or dog(s) when they come to us.
